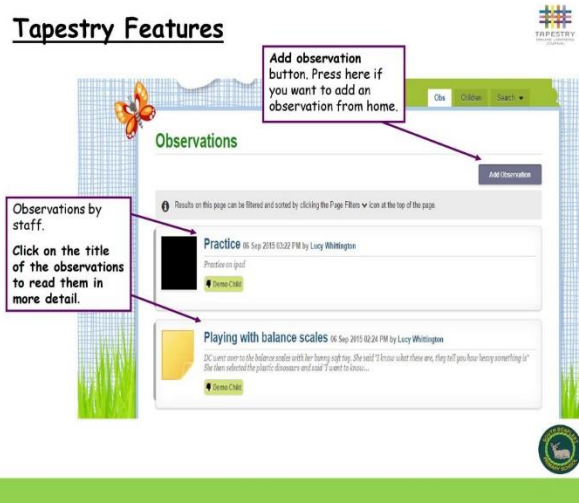


Did you know that you can 'like' and 'comment' on the observations that you have seen on Tapestry. You can also add your own observations, which is fantastic as it gives us an insight into what your child can do at home too.

Tapestry Features



We have put together this guide to help you if you would like to add observations from home. After you have logged in, click on the blue 'Add observation' box in the top right hand corner. You can then type a title, add notes/comments and upload files such as photos and videos.

Below are some ideas of things that would be useful to observe at home or out and about with your child.

PSED – Personal, social and emotional development:

- Taking turns playing games with family and siblings
- Starting a new club or trying something new
- Winning a medal/Trophy or being proud of something they have achieved
- Helping at home – shopping, tidying away toys, help taking care of younger sibling

L – Literacy

Reading:

- Reading books at home
- Trips to the library
- Reading notices/signs

Writing:

- Writing birthday cards, thank you letters
- Birthday, Christmas or shopping lists
- Postcards from holidays
- Pictures and notes made for you!

CL – Communication and language:

- Listening to stories at bedtime and talking about what happened
- Watching a show/pantomime
- Talking about their day

PD – Physical development

Moving and handling

- Managing play equipment at the park
- Riding bikes and scooters
- Help building something at home-DIY
- Doing up fastenings on clothes such as zips and buttons

Health and self-care

- Getting dressed themselves.
- Brushing their teeth.
- Eating healthy food, and understanding how to keep healthy by exercising.
- Keeping safe e.g. waiting to cross the road, not touching the oven etc.

<p>EAD – Expressive arts and design:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Putting on shows for the family • Role play at home- mummy and daddy with teddies
